



What Makes a Trained Leader?



Adult leaders in units are considered trained and are eligible to wear the official trained emblem once they have completed Youth Protection Training and the training courses outlined below or have completed Youth Protection Training and a previous basic training course when it was current.

Youth Protection Training* is a joining requirement for all registered adults and must be taken every two years!
